# Open the Door

A campaign to help the public spot the signs of domestic abuse and know where to get help was recently launched.

The 'Open the Door' campaign, aims to equip people with the tools to feel safe and confident in having a conversation about unhealthy relationships.

It has been developed by a partnership of a domestic abuse survivor group, Cheshire East Council, Cheshire West and Chester Council, Halton and Warrington Borough Councils, the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner, Cheshire Constabulary and Public Health England.

The partnership is seeking to encourage victims, perpetrators, friends and family to get information about how to spot the signs and access early help. It is the first time that the police and all four local authorities have joined forces to provide support for residents about what is available for them locally.

The campaign encourages friends and family to trust their instincts, as many of the initial signs and symptoms of abuse can be tricky to spot from the outside, including:

*Undermining you, so you lose confidence*

*Isolating you from your friends and family*

*Making all the decisions in your life, including what you wear, who you talk to and where you go and when*

*Making you do things that you don't want to do*

*Controlling your money*

*Following you when you go out*

*Needing to know where you are at all times*

A survivor group helped inform the campaign, sharing their experiences and the support they received. One member of the group, Amy said: "It was my abuser's Mum who handed me the domestic abuse helpline number. People had told me before 'he's no good for you, you need to get away, you'll be happier without him'. When she handed me that card, I knew it was time, I needed to get myself back, I'd lost myself."
