Awesome Attendance! Well done to Y5 for winning the attendance trophy last week with 100%. Amazing! It's no wonder you're the best you can be!

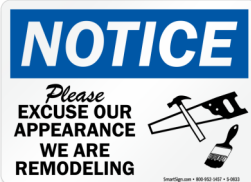


A New Look!
