KS2 Outcomes:

There were 9 children in our Year 6 class eligible for Pupil Premium in 2015 – 2016.

Attainment

67% of our Pupil Premium eligible children met or exceeded the expected standard in Reading.

67% of our Pupil Premium eligible children met or exceeded the expected standard in Writing.

56% of our Pupil Premium eligible children met or exceeded the expected standard in Maths.

KS1 Outcomes:

There were 6 children in our Year 2 class eligible for Pupil Premium in 2015 – 2016.

33% of our Pupil Premium eligible children met or exceeded the expected standard in Reading.

17% of our Pupil Premium eligible children met or exceeded the expected standard in Writing.

50% of our Pupil Premium eligible children met or exceeded the expected standard in Maths.

Year 1 Phonics Outcomes:

There were 8 children in our Year 1 class eligible for Pupil Premium in 2015 – 2016.

75% of our Pupil Premium eligible children met or exceeded the expected standard in Phonics.

Foundation Stage Good Level of Development

There were 7 children in our Reception class eligible for Pupil Premium in 2015 -2016.

43 % of our Pupil Premium eligible children met or exceeded the expected standard at the end of Foundation stage.
